Wall Township Maintains Level Services in 2011 Budget

In adopting the municipal purposes budget for 2011, the Wall Township Committee was able to present a plan for providing all municipal operations at current levels of service. In addition, the budget for water and sewer remains constant.

The municipal budget provides adequate funding for all departmental functions and core missions, which remain the same.

The total budget for 2011 is \$34,957,242. The increases over the 2010 municipal budget are attributable primarily to three areas: State of NJ determined Pension costs increased by \$567,054, the State mandated reserve for uncollected taxes increased \$99,129, and debt service expenses rose by \$266,248 this year.

While state aid has stabilized this year, the amount does not make up for significant losses in state aid during prior years. Also, for a second year in a row there was a significant loss of ratables which has negative impact on the revenues in the budget.

As a result of increased costs, this year's budget requires a \$.016 increase in municipal purpose taxes, 1.6 cents for every \$100 of assessed valuation. For a home assessed at \$310,000, the Township average, that means a \$49.60 increase for the year in the municipal purpose tax.

The 2011 budget meets all state requirements while remaining within the 2 percent cap on property taxes.

Several points provide better understanding in analyzing the 2011 budget.

- The Committee has succeeded in maintaining services with a reduced workforce. Currently there are 194 active employees. This is a reduction of 7.6% from last year when there were 210 active employees. This is also a 16.4% reduction from 2008 when there were 232 active employees.
- The Township Committee cut operating expenses for every department. While most operating expenses had already been frozen at 2006 levels, tough economic times compel the township to reduce them even further.
- The budgeted amount for salary and wages has remained consistent over the past two years.

The Township Committee is committed to continuing to pursue efficiencies in municipal operations as exemplified by the introduction of single-stream recycling which was implemented in June of 2011. The Township will continue to keep costs down through shared service agreements with other municipalities. Currently, Wall Township maintains shared service agreements with municipalities throughout Monmouth County for purchasing insurance, processing sewerage waste, sharing court systems and a recycling center. The Township purchases goods and services jointly with Monmouth County and other towns. The Township maintains agreements with neighboring municipalities that pay for services rendered by Wall Township's municipal employees. The Township also saves significant amounts through shared services with the Wall Township Public Schools and by participating in the Regional Health Commission.

The Township Committee will continue exploring ideas such as those detailed above for further savings.

The Committee also will continue to look for innovative ways to save within Township operations by streamlining programs and seeking innovative approaches to conducting the business of municipal government.

Wall Township's Single-Stream Recycling:

Saving the Planet as Well as Landfill Fees

Since June 6th, 2011 the Township has implemented a Single-Stream Recycling Program which has made recycling more convenient for residents and will generate funds in the municipal budget.

Single-stream recycling is a system that combines the two streams of recyclable materials, newspaper and comingled containers into one recycling can. Residents will be able to place all items currently recycled in the same trash can for pick up at the curb on their assigned days. Under the single-stream approach, the comingled materials are hauled to a processing plant with the capacity to separate them mechanically. The separated materials are then sold and reprocessed. The Township retains part of the profit.

Since the new recycling program began, Wall Township residents have enjoyed twice a month pick-up at the curb. The new zone schedule is located on page 5 of this newsletter. More detailed information can be found at www.wallnj.com/recycle. Current trash and bulk pick-up schedules remain unchanged.

The single-stream program expands the list of items that may be placed in the recycling container to include flat cardboard, magazines, junk mail and newspaper. In order to ensure the safety of our Township employees, we ask that residents please make sure their recycling containers do not weigh more than 50 lbs.

What Goes Into the Recycling Can?

- Newspaper, office paper, junk mail, envelopes, magazines
- Flat corrugated cardboard, cereal boxes
- Glass bottles and jars
- Metal food and beverage containers
- Plastic water, soda and milk bottles, shampoo and detergent bottles

What Goes in the Regular Trash Can?

- Food, coffee grounds, etc.
- Plastic bags including plastic shopping bags, plastic wrap
- Waxed pizza boxes, paper plates
- Diapers
- Plastic utensils, deli containers etc.
- Styrofoam
- Wire, wire hangers, Christmas lights
- Window glass, ceramics, dishware

Wall Township's Recycling Drop-Off Centers are located on Tiltens Corner Road adjacent to the South Wall Little League fields and off of Monmouth Boulevard, where the Township recently opened a new recycling drop-off center. The recycling centers' hours of operations are Monday through Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 3:15 p.m. and Saturday from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Many materials are accepted at both recycling center locations including: household trash, recycling material, electronics, tires, metal, white goods, bulk items, batteries, leaves and brush. Items that are not accepted include: propane tanks, antifreeze, motor oil, concrete, asbestos and paint. Please call **County Hazardous Waste** for disposal of these items at 732-922-2234. Since June 6th 2011, Wall Township has participated in single stream recycling. Don't know what new recycling zone your home is located in? Please see the recycling zone map located on page 5 for assistance. Your recycling is now being picked up **twice a month!** For more information please visit www.wallnj.com/recycle.

Please help us go green by following these important recycling tips:

- DO NOT tie up newspapers and cardboard – just throw right in the can; please flatten cardboard
- DO NOT put recyclables in plastic bags or trash bags
- Trash cans may not be heavier than 50 lbs.
- Use a trash can with a lid to ensure that papers do not blow away or get wet
- No hinged-lid trash cans
- Empty and lightly rinse all containers

No need to remove:

Tape, paper clips, staples, stamps, labels, metal fasteners, rubber bands, plastic tabs, post-it notes.





The Recycling Centers will NOT be open during holidays as shown above. All recycling pick up scheduled for holidays will be picked up the following Wednesday.

Recycling Container Restrictions

Recycling containers placed curbside for pick up may not be heavier than 50 lbs. Proper labels must be used and they should be facing the street. **DO NOT** put out in plastic bags. **DO NOT** use containers with hinged lids. Labels are available, free of charge, at town hall, Dept. of Public Works and both

Recycling Centers. There is no limit on the number of recycling containers per household.

Household Trash Container Restrictions

Containers placed curbside for trash pickup may not exceed 45 gallon capacity. **DO NOT** use hinged-lid trash cans. There is a limit of 6 household trash containers per household.

No Commercial Vehicles

NO contractor or landscaping trailers allowed in recycling center. All Township residents using the Recycling Center must have a sticker. Concrete, cement and bricks will **NOT** be picked up or accepted at either recycling center.

Bulk Pick Up Days

Each area of the Township will have one designated bulk pickup day on a Wednesday each month. This bulk pickup day will take place unless the date in question falls on a Township holiday as above. Your bulk pickup week for your pickup zone is shown on the attached map and chart. On your designated bulk pickup day, the Township will pickup household appliances (any freon unit-fee is charged). Also included is debris resulting from minor alterations to a private residence by the owner, such as a window, a door, and small amount of wood. A fee is charged due to the fact that the Township must pay a premium to get rid of building materials. One

(1) room of carpeting will be taken at

no charge from homeowner at curb. **There will be no scheduled pick up other than your bulk pick up.** Wooden sheds will not be picked up. Pick up of metal sheds will be allowed on bulk days. Place at curb prior to 5:30 am on the day of your bulk pickup. As stated, bulk pickup will not be provided during holidays observed by the Township. It should be noted that the Township does not provide curbside pickup of tires. Tires must be taken to the Atlantic Avenue or North Wall Recycling Centers.

Please note there is no fee for disposal of cardboard at the Recycling Centers. **DO NOT** put materials out for bulk pickup until the Monday before your scheduled Wednesday pickup. Call DPW office the Monday of your bulk week for foreman to determine the fee payment for your chargeable items. The purpose of household bulk pickup is for the convenience of Wall Township residents. **All bulk items are picked up on a 10-item basis.** Any questions regarding volume or quantity, please call the Department of Public Works, 732-449-2700, before items are placed at the curb.

Medical Waste and Needles

Shall not be picked up. Contact Monmouth County Regional Health Commission at 732-493-9520.

Miscellaneous Waste

Electronic waste including TVs, computers, stereos, etc. may be brought to either recycling center. Both recycling centers also accept tires, metal, white goods, bulk items, batteries, household trash, recycling, leaves and brush. Items that are not accepted include: propane tanks, antifreeze, motor oil, concrete, asbestos and paint. Please call County Hazardous Waste for disposal of these items - 732-922-2234.

Brush/Leaf Pickup Schedules

Brush will be picked up starting Monday of your bulk pickup week. Please have brush out at the curb the weekend before your bulk week. **DO NOT** put it out any sooner (see map on page 6 for your zone). Brush will be picked up during your bulk week May, June and September. The brush shall be a maximum length of 4 feet, with a maximum pile size of 4' x 3' x 8' (3.5 cyds.) placed at curbside in a neat and orderly fashion, butt ends facing street, free from viney material and leaves. Township Code 191-3 will be strictly enforced. **During times of extreme storms please call the Department of Public Works or check www.wallnj.com for a special brush pick-up schedule.**

Leaves will be picked up during **Fall Season - November through December and Spring Season - April.** Leaves must be put at the curb neatly at the edge of the road. **NOT** to be mixed with viney materials, twigs and evergreen prunings. **DO NOT** put the leaves or brush in plastic bags as they will not be picked up. **IMPORTANT:** Homeowners – Notify landscapers of schedule for leaf/brush pickup. Put out brush for scheduled bulk week – not before or after.

Grass clippings are accepted at the Tiltons Corner Road Recycling Center. There is **NO** pickup of grass. Thank you for your cooperation. If you have any questions please call 732-449-2700.

Paying Your Water/Sewer and Tax Bills

You don't have to write checks each quarter! We have 3 convenient and safe ways to pay your Water/Sewer and Tax bills:

- **DIRECT DEBIT – (free)**

Have your checking or savings account debited each quarter. This option can be used for your Water/Sewer and/or Tax bills. There are no fees for using this service.

Please see the reverse side of this page for the application, and return it with your Water/Sewer or Tax Payment. Direct Debit will be deducted each quarter on the due date of your bill. A voided check is necessary with your application.

- **EBILL – www.mcc.net**

You can make a payment online by logging onto www.mcc.net. An ACH transaction will cost you .25 cents, less than the cost of a stamp. This transaction comes out of your checking or savings account and can be used to pay Water/Sewer or Tax bills. MCC.net also takes Discover, Mastercard and Visa for tax payments only. Discover and Mastercard are available for Water/Sewer payments. Refer to the payment schedule fee while you are processing your transaction (approximately 2.99%). You will be asked if you agree to the service charge before you submit the payment. Prior year delinquencies will not be accepted at this site.

- **OFFICIAL PAYMENTS – www.officialpayments.com**

This option allows you to pay your Water/Sewer or Tax bill by using one of the following credit cards - American Express, Visa, Mastercard and Discover Card. Official Payments does charge a convenience fee of 3% passed on to the customer. You will be asked if you agree to the service charge before you submit the payment.

You can also call Official Payments to pay Water/Sewer or Taxes. The phone number is 1-800-272-9829. You will be asked for a jurisdiction code, use wall code \$4044.
