ORDINANCE NO. 21-2015

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WALL,
IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AMENDING AND
SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 191, ARTICLE II, SECTION 14, REGARDING
COMMERCIAL, BUSINESS, INDUSTRIAL, AND PRIVATE INSTITUTIONAL
RECYCLING AND REPORTING REQUIREMENTS**

WHEREAS, the Township Committee regulates the storage, collection and disposal of commercial and industrial solid waste and recyclables by and through Chapter 191, Article II, Section 14 of the Code of the Township of Wall; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Committee wishes to amend Chapter 191 to update the definitions and to provide guidance for customers of private garbage haulers and private garbage haulers regarding municipal recycling requirements; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Wall finds that it is in the best interest of the citizens of the Township of Wall to supplement and amend Chapter 191 to update the definitions and to provide private haulers with the option to implement single stream recycling and require commercial, business, industrial, and private institutions to report recycling amounts on a yearly basis to Township officials; and,

NOW, BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Wall, in the County of Monmouth, in the State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 191, Article II, Section 14, "Commercial, Business, Industrial and Private Institution Recycling and Single Stream Recycling" of the Code of the Township of Wall shall be retitled as indicated above and amended to add new subsections (H) (I) and (J) as follows:

H. Customers of private haulers shall comply with the requirements of Subsections A through G as set forth herein. In the alternative, if mandated by private haulers, customers shall employ single stream recycling as defined in this Section. SINGLE STREAM RECYCLING – also known as 'source separation' or "fully commingled" or "single sort" recycling is defined as a system in which all paper fibers, plastics, metals, and other containers are mixed in a collection truck, instead of being sorted by the depositor into separate commodities (paper, newspaper, paperboard, corrugated fiberboard, plastic, glass, cans, aluminum) and handled separately throughout the collection process. In single-stream, both the collection and processing systems are designed to handle this fully commingled mixture of recyclables, with materials being separated for reuse at a materials recovery facility.

I. Commercial, Business, Industrial and Private Institution establishments are required to report on a yearly basis to the Wall Township Municipal Recycling Coordinator, on such forms as may be prescribed, regarding recycling activities at their premises, including the amount and type of recycled material not placed curbside for municipal collection. If material is removed from the premises by a hauler, recycler or paper shredder, the quantity and final disposition of the material is to be reported on the form.

J. Exemptions: pursuant to N.J.S.A 13:1E-99.16(d) the Wall Township Committee may exempt persons occupying commercial, business, industrial and private institutional establishments within the Wall Township boundaries from the source separation requirements of the ordinance which requires persons generating municipal solid waste within its municipal boundaries to source separate

from the municipal solid waste stream, the specified recyclable materials if those persons have otherwise provided for the recycling of all designated recyclable materials. To be eligible for an exemption pursuant to this Chapter, a commercial, business, industrial and private institutional generator shall file an application for exemption with the Township recycling coordinator on forms provided for that purpose. The form shall conform to the requirements of N.J.S.A 13:1E-99.16(d).


Section 2. All Ordinances, or parts thereof, inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.



Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and publication according to law.
