# **PROPERTY REVALUATION** *Frequently Asked Questions*

## **Why were new appraisals necessary?**

State law requires that all property owners pay their fair share of the municipality's tax levy and a town wide revaluation is necessary every 10 years or so to ensure this. The last appraisal in Wall Township was in 2001 and the County Tax Board ordered Wall Township to do this current appraisal.

## **How was my property appraised?**

Residential values were determined by analyzing the market data in your neighborhood and comparing them to the individual property being valued. Commercial properties may have been valued based on both the sales (where applicable) and market driven income analysis.

## **I have not improved my house since the last revaluation, why is it higher?**

The last revaluation was based on the real estate market of 2001. The market has changed significantly since this time. At the start of this revaluation Monmouth County determined the assessments across Wall Township represented approximately 65% of the current market value. Thus, as an example, a home worth \$300,000 in the current market would have been assessed at about \$195,000.

## **Why did my assessment change so much since last year?**

The assessments for 2015 were based on the revaluation from 2001. The new assessment for 2016 are based on the current market value.

## **Does the new assessment make my property taxes go up?**

Not necessarily. New property assessments do not automatically result in higher property taxes. This is because while values go up, the tax rate used to calculate your bill will go down. For example, a home assessed for 200,000 multiplied by a rate of \$3.00 would pay \$6,000. If that same home is now worth 400,000 after the revaluation and the rate is \$1.50 they would pay the same \$6,000.

## **How is the tax rate determined?**

The Monmouth County Tax Board calculates the tax rate each year. They divide the "Total Levy" (sum of the municipal, county, fire district, and school budgets) by the "Net Valuation Taxable" (Wall's total assessment). For example, in 2015 the total Levy was 106,631,094.80 and the Net Valuation taxable was 3,692,852,810 for a rate of \$2.888

## **When can I see other new assessments in Wall Township?**

After the revaluation has been certified by the Monmouth County Tax Board, the assessments will be available at either the Tax Assessor's office or on the Monmouth County Open public records website.

## **When will I see the new assessment on my tax bill?**

The new assessment will appear on your tax bill in July of 2016. The first payment based on the new assessed value and the reduced tax rate will be due in August of 2016. *The bills that are sent out in February and May 2016 will not reflect any change.*

## **Can I appeal the assessment and what is the appeal process?**

If you appeal, be prepared to present recent sales of comparable properties in your community that support your opinion of the value of your property. You can only appeal your assessment, not your taxes.

## **Who do I call if I have questions or concerns?**

## DOG LICENSE

### Renewal

**License Renewal Reminder**  
New Jersey Statute states that all dogs must be licensed annually. In order to procure a license from Wall Township, please review the application requirements listed below.

All dogs must be licensed during **January of each and every year**, regardless of when a license was purchased the previous year. A summons can be issued for not purchasing a license any time after **February 1**.

#### Application Requirements:

- **DOG OF LICENSING AGE** - According to Wall Township Ordinance 65 -3, this is defined as "Any dog which has attained the age of 7 (seven) months or which possesses a permanent set of teeth."
- **PROOF OF VALID RABIES VACCINATION** - State law requires that your dog's rabies vaccination must be valid through **October 31**. If your dog's rabies vaccination expires *anytime* between January and October, of the current year, the dog will need to be re-vaccinated before a license can be issued.
- **PROOF OF SPAY/NEUTER** - Dogs are not required to be neutered. If the dog is not neutered/ spayed a population control fee of \$3.00 will be added to the cost of the license.
- **PAYMENT – Checks or Cash (Exact Change Preferred)** *Please make sure to include proper payment*
  - Dogs that have been **spayed or neutered**
    - \$12.00 (twelve dollars)
    - \$17.00 (seventeen dollars) if completed application received **after January 31**.
  - Dogs that have **not been spayed or neutered**
    - \$15.00 (fifteen dollars)
    - \$20.00 (twenty dollars) if completed application received **after January 31**.


## DOG PARK

### Guidelines


- Owners are legally responsible for their dogs and any injuries caused by them.
- Puppies and dogs must be properly licensed, inoculated and healthy.
- Animals should wear a collar and municipally issued ID tags at all times.
- Owners must clean up after their dogs.
- Dogs showing aggression towards people or other animals will be removed from the park.
- Owners should not leave their dogs unattended or allowed out of sight.
- Owners must carry a leash, not more than 6ft long, at all times. Dogs should be leashed before and prior to leaving the park.
- Violators will be subject to removal from the park and suspension of park privileges.

## HELP US FIND YOU

### Wall Police Ask Residents and Businesses to Post Street Addresses

In an effort to improve emergency services (police, fire and first aid) response time, all township residents and business owners are asked to clearly post their street address in an area visible from the road on which it fronts. Emergency services are continually experiencing delays in rendering aid because homes and businesses are not clearly numbered.

**Residential numbers should be no less than two inches high and one inch wide. Non-residential buildings are required to have numbers no less than six inches high and two inches wide.** Please refer to Township Ordinance 79.1 and 140-123 for further information

The Wall Township Police recognize that there are sections of town that have their post office assigned numbers (normally one to three digits) affixed to their homes, light

posts or fence. The police department is not asking that these numbers be removed only that your tax assessed house numbers, usually a four digit number, be posted as well. If a resident were to call 911 for an emergency their four digit tax assessed number would appear on the emergency dispatchers screen, not their post office assigned number.

It is the goal of all emergency service workers everywhere to respond as quickly as possible. Clearly posting street addresses certainly assists in improving response time. Seconds and minutes wasted may lead to the loss of life and property.

## WALL TOWNSHIP POLICE ACCREDITATION

The Wall Township Police Department received their New Jersey State Association of the Chiefs of Police Accreditation Award from NJSACOP Program Coordinator Harry J. Delgado on Wednesday, July 29, 2015 at the Township of Wall Committee Meeting. Accredited status represents a significant professional achievement. The Wall Township Police Department complied with a total of 100 standards in order to achieve accreditation recognition.

Accreditation status represents the successful implementation of policies and procedures that are conceptually sound and operationally effective. Accreditation status also results in greater accountability within the agency, reduced risk and liability exposure, stronger defense against civil lawsuits,

increased community advocacy, and more confidence in the agency's ability to operate efficiently and respond to community concerns.

NJSACOP Assessors came to the Wall Township Police Department to conduct an onsite inspection. In March, 2015 a commission review hearing was held and the Wall Township Police Department was recommended to become an accredited agency. The accredited status that was granted by the NJSACOP is effective for three years. The Wall Township Police Department received its initial accreditation in April of 2010.



# **PUBLIC WORKS** *Frequently Asked Questions*

**When will my household trash collection and/or recycling collection take place?** Household trash will be picked up once a week AND recycling will be picked up once a week. There is also an interactive map at [www.wallnj.com](http://www.wallnj.com) that allows you see your collection days simply by typing in your address! Please remember that cans need to be placed 3 feet apart and cannot be placed near cars, mailboxes, etc.

**Can I use my own store bought trash cans?** NO. The automated trucks will only pick up the Township issued containers. Trash or recycling containers will not be collected.

**Can I have more than one container for garbage or recycling?** YES. You may call Public Works at 732-449-2700 x5 and order additional trash and recycling containers for a fee. Trash Can Fees: 96 gallon - \$56; 64 gallon - \$54; 48 gallon - \$51. Recycling Can Fees: 96 Gallon - \$28; 64 gallon - \$27; 48 gallon - \$26.

**Can I exchange my trash and/or recycling container for a different size?** YES! You may call Public Works at 732-449-2700 x5 to request the exchange. Please note: As of January 1, 2016, if you would like to exchange your can you will be charged the can fees shown above.

**What happens if my container breaks or needs repair?** The containers are municipal property. If one is in need of repair, please call the Wall Township Public Works Department at 732-449-2700 x5.

**Who owns the containers?** The containers are Wall Township property.

**What items/materials are permitted in the containers?** Household **Trash** containers – please have trash bagged and then place in the Township container. The following items are NOT permitted in the household trash container – concrete, cement, bricks, medical waste, electronics, brush, leaf material, and grass clippings. **Recycling** Containers – please place single stream recycling material directly in the Township container. Additional information on Single Stream Recycling is available at [www.wallnj.com/recycle](http://www.wallnj.com/recycle). **PLEASE NO PLASTIC BAGS IN THE RECYCLING CONTAINERS!**

**How will the township monitor recycling efforts?** The Township will do random checks of containers to ensure residents are recycling the proper materials. Please remember that proper recycling methods help the Township save in landfill tipping fees. Residents will be given a reminder if state mandated recycling laws are not being followed. Wall Township's Single Stream Recycling Program has been able to save tens of thousands of dollars in landfill fees. These savings ultimately affect your tax dollar! Thank you for your efforts!



**Can I still bring recycling material to the township recycling centers?** YES! Wall Township's Recycling Centers are located on Tiltons Corner Road adjacent to the South Wall Little League fields and off Monmouth Boulevard on the Marconi Complex site, behind the North Wall Little League fields.

Both Recycling Centers accept items including: household trash, appliances, recycling materials, electronics, tires, metal, 10 large bulk items, leaves, brush, grass and batteries (car and household).

Items that are NOT accepted include: propane tanks, antifreeze, motor oil, concrete, bricks, construction waste, asbestos, paint, and medical waste. No box trucks, rental trucks, contractor or landscaping trailers are allowed in the recycling centers. No truck larger than a pickup truck is permitted.

**Can I bring wood and/or construction debris to the township recycling centers?** YES! Any wood and construction debris brought to the Wall Township Recycling Centers is subject to a fee. Residents are allowed to bring in up to one pickup truck load. NO contractors.

**Be sure that your vehicle has a Wall township recycling sticker!** ALL RESIDENTS must have a recycling sticker on their vehicle in order to enter the recycling centers. You can obtain a sticker at the Public Works Office at 2301 Tiltons Corner Road or print out the form online and mail in. **All residents MUST bring their license and registration when obtaining a sticker at the office!** More information can be found at [www.wallnj.com](http://www.wallnj.com).

**When are BULK pickup days?** Bulk will be collected ONCE A MONTH either on a Thursday or Friday. To see your Bulk pickup day (as well as trash and recycling days) please visit the interactive map at [www.wallnj.com](http://www.wallnj.com). The interactive map allows you to simply type in your address to determine your collection days. You can also view the new routes and collection days in this newsletter.

The purpose of Household Bulk Pickup is for the convenience of the Wall Township residents. **No more than 10 items of bulk can be put to the curb.** Items permitted for curbside bulk pickup include: appliances (any Freon unit – fee is charged), furniture, one room of carpeting (must be dry, cut and bundled for handling), etc. Items that will not be picked up on bulk days include: wooden sheds, wood fencing, wooden swing sets, decks, tires, construction debris, etc. *Contractors are responsible for their trade/construction waste.*

Please place all bulk items at your curb PRIOR to 5:30am on the day of your bulk pickup. *Please note: bulk pickup will not be provided during holidays observed by the Township.* Any questions regarding the quantity or the type of material accepted at curbside bulk pickup, please call the Department of Public Works at 732-449-2700 x5.

## Monday Holidays

When a holiday falls on a Monday the collection schedule for household trash and recycling will be pushed back by one day. Normal Monday trash/recycling will be picked up on Tuesday, normal Tuesday trash/recycling will be picked up on Wednesday, etc. Bulk will be collected on the normal schedule.

## Tuesday/Wednesday/Thursday Holidays

When a holiday falls in the middle of the week (Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday) all collection days before the holiday will not be affected. All collection routes that were to be picked up on the holiday or the days after the holiday, will be pushed back by one day. Bulk will be collected on the normal schedule. Thursday holiday bulk will be collected on the Friday after the holiday.

## Friday Holidays

When a holiday falls on a Friday, household trash and recycling schedules will not be affected. All bulk will be collected on the Thursday before the holiday.

## Thanksgiving Week

The Township is closed on Thanksgiving and the Friday after Thanksgiving. Recycling normally picked up on Thursday will be picked up the Wednesday before Thanksgiving. Bulk pickup scheduled for this week will be collected BEFORE the holiday - bulk pickup will take place Tuesday and Wednesday of Thanksgiving week.

## ELECTRONIC WASTE

Electronic waste including TVs, computers, stereos, cell phones, printers, etc. will NOT be collected at your curb. These items can be brought to either Township Recycling Center for disposal.

## HAZARDOUS WASTE

Paint, antifreeze, motor oil, asbestos, chemicals, propane tank, fertilizer, propane tanks, etc. are NOT accepted at the recycling centers. These items can be brought to the Monmouth County Hazardous Waste facility at 3211 Shafto Road, Tinton Falls. Contact them at 732-683-8686 x5210.

## MEDICAL WASTE AND NEEDLES

These items will NOT be picked up. Contact Monmouth County Regional Health Commission at 732-493-9520 for more information.

**GRASS CLIPPINGS** are accepted at both Township Recycling Centers. There is NO pickup of grass. DO NOT put grass in trash or recycling containers. Thank you for your cooperation. If you have any questions please call 732-449-2700 x5.

**CONCRETE, BRICKS/PAVERS, ROOFING SHINGLES, STONE, ASPHALT, CINDER BLOCKS, ETC** are NOT accepted at either Township Recycling Center. These items can be brought to an outside, authorized debris disposal facility.

**CHRISTMAS TREES** will be picked up twice during January only. Dates will be posted on [www.wallnj.com](http://www.wallnj.com) and in the Coast Star newspaper. Christmas Trees must be brought to the curb and free of all lights and NO bags, etc. Christmas Trees can also be brought to either Township Recycling Centers.



*No commercial vehicles are permitted at either recycling center.*

## Single Stream Recycling

*The process in which all paper, plastics, metal and other containers are mixed together instead of being sorted into separate commodities.*

## Schedule Reminder

### BRUSH PICKUP

- BRUSH PICKUP — takes place during 4 months of the year.
- Fall Season — September and October
- Spring Season — May and June
- Summer / Winter Season - No Brush Pickup
- Brush Pickup coordinates with your residential Bulk Week schedule.
- Brush Pickup starts the Monday of your Bulk Week as per posted schedule.
- Please place brush at curbside in a neat and orderly fashion starting on the Friday prior to the Monday of your scheduled Brush Pickup.
- The Brush pile shall be a maximum length of 4 feet with a maximum pile size of 4'x3'x8' (3.5 cyds.), butt ends facing the street, free from viney material and leaves.
- IMPORTANT: Homeowners - It is your responsibility to notify your landscaper of your scheduled Brush Pickup week.

*\*Brush materials will only be picked up as per scheduled dates. All other times, brush materials must be brought to either North or South Wall Recycling Centers, M-F 7:30am-3:15pm or Saturday 8am-3pm, Public Works Dept at 732-449-2700 ext 2.*

### LEAF PICKUP

- LEAF PICKUP — takes place during 3 months of the year.
- Fall Season — November and December
- Spring Season — April
- Summer / Winter Season - No Leaf Pickup
- Leaf Pickup coordinates with your residential Bulk Week schedule.
- Leaf Pickup starts the Monday of your bulk week as per posted schedule.
- Please place leaves at curbside in a neat and orderly fashion starting on the Friday prior to the Monday of your scheduled Leaf Pickup.
- Do not put leaves in plastic or paper bags, as they will not be picked up.
- IMPORTANT: Homeowners - It is your responsibility to notify your landscaper of your scheduled Leaf Pickup week. Street by street pick-up listings will be posted in the Coast Star each week. This information is also available at [www.wallnj.com](http://www.wallnj.com)

## CAN A PIZZA BOX BE RECYCLED?



*Here is the not so simple answer.*

Here's the problem. Cardboard pizza boxes are technically recyclable. However, pizza contains grease and greasy residue contaminates paper destined for recycling mills. Paper fibers can't be separated from the oils, ruining the whole batch of recycling. This contamination costs the paper industry up to \$700 million per year.

**If you're a pizza lover who also loves to recycle, what can you do?**


Recycle just the parts of the box that have NO grease or food stuck to them. If the lid is grease free, tear it off and recycle it, while trashing the greasy bottom. If the box has grease, top and bottom, then do the right thing, and trash the entire box.



**Year End Statements Are Not Provided.** The total yearly tax is listed on the tax bill or can be found online at our website. The Assessment Cards from the Assessor's Office should NOT be used for filing taxes as they do not include any deductions, adjustments or rebates.

Any property with a delinquency greater than \$10,000 (tax, water, sewer and/or sprinkler) on Dec 31st will be subject to a 6% Year End Penalty.

Additional Fees shall apply when list is compiled. Liens purchased by a 3rd Party may be foreclosed after two (2) years. Liens defaulted to the Township may be foreclosed after six (6) months.
