On June 8, 2019, a group of fifty local Wall Township citizens and many Grace Bible Church volunteers cleaned the roadsides of the southern section of Allaire State Park. Wall Township Mayor Kevin Orender and Committeeman Tim Farell welcomed the volunteers and recognized the value of their volunteer efforts.

This part of the Allaire State Park drains to Barnegat Bay and the clean-up is part of the 10th watershed-wide Barnegat Bay Blitz,” said Kyra Hoffmann, Team Captain.

Over 28 bags of trash and 5 bags of recyclables were collected in two hours. Monmouth County Clean Communities provided supplies and proper disposal of the litter collected.

The 660-square-mile Barnegat Bay watershed includes all or parts of 37 municipalities in Ocean and Monmouth counties, including Wall Township.




Monmouth County Clean Communities provided supplies and proper disposal of the litter collected. “One positive note of the clean-up was the reduced amount of litter that was found compared to previous years,” noted Wilma Morrissey, chairperson of the Wall Township Environmental Advisory Committee. All volunteers, including many led by Pastor Randy Smith from the nearby Grace Bible Church, contributed to making the cleanup a success.



Over the years, nearly 32,000 volunteers have collected some 4,600 cubic yards of trash, recyclables and debris from areas within the watershed, including wetlands, forests, parks, storm drains, docks and creeks and the bay itself through the Blitz clean-ups.
