Governor Murphy has mandated all NJ voters be sent mail-in ballots for the 2020 General Election. On November 3rd, Election Day, polling locations will be limited and voting machines will only be available for those with disabilities. Per the State mandate, everyone else who wants to vote in-person must use a paper provisional ballot, which will be counted after all mail-in ballots. Here are answers to some frequently asked questions.

1. How do I obtain a mail-in ballot for voting in the 2020 General Election?

All active registered voters will automatically be sent mail-in ballots for voting in the General Election by early October. You do not need to apply.

2. HOW DO I KNOW IF I AM AN ACTIVE OR INACTIVE VOTER?

Go to the "Voter Information" tab on the MonmouthCountyVotes.com website and click on "Am I Registered?" or call the Superintendent of Elections at 732-431-7780

3. WHAT IF I DO NOT RECEIVE MY BALLOT, OR IF I MISPLACE OR DAMAGE MY BALLOT?

You can contact the County Clerk's Election Office at 732-431-7790.

4. CAN I STILL VOTE AT THE POLLS ON ELECTION DAY?

Yes, but only voters requiring an ADA accessible voting device will be permitted to vote on a machine. All others must vote by paper provisional ballot, which will be provided at the polling location. Otherwise, you can drop off your completed mailin ballot at the polling location.

5. CAN I GO TO MY REGULAR POLLING LOCATION?

There will be a limited number of polling locations open on November 3rd. You will be notified of your polling location closer to Election Day by way of a postcard that you will receive in the mail in late October.

6. HOW DO I COMPLETE THE MAIL-IN BALLOT?

Use only a black or blue pen to mark your selections. Place the ballot in the envelope with the certificate attached and seal it. Do not detach the certificate flap from the envelope. Then, complete the certificate and sign it.

Afterwards, place that envelope into the return envelope addressed to the County Board of Elections in Freehold. Make sure the voter identification barcode on the label appears through the window. Then, seal that envelope. No postage is necessary.

7. CAN SOMEONE HELP ME COMPLETE THE BALLOT?

Yes. This person is called an "Assistor" and must complete the "Assistor" section of the certificate attached to the inner envelope. You, the voter, must sign the certificate.

8. How do I return my mail-in ballot for counting?

All ballots will come with a postage paid return envelope. You can return your ballot in one of four ways: 1) via U.S. Postal Service mail; 2) via secure ballot drop box in your County, see locations on the back of this brochure; 3) by dropping it off at the County Board of Elections Office at 300 Halls Mill Road in Freehold; or 4) by bringing it to your polling location on Election Day.

9. ARE THERE DEADLINES FOR RETURNING MY VOTED MAIL-IN BALLOT?

Yes. If you are using the U.S. Postal Service, the ballot must be postmarked by November 3rd. If you are using one of the County's secure drop boxes, or delivering it to the County Board of Elections or to your polling location, the ballot must be delivered by the close of the polls, November 3rd at 8 p.m.

10. CAN I DELIVER SOMEONE ELSE'S BALLOT TO A POLLING LOCATION?

No. You may only bring your own ballot.

11. CAN I DELIVER SOMEONE ELSE'S BALLOT TO A DROP BOX, A MAIL BOX, OR TO THE COUNTY BOARD OF ELECTIONS IN FREEHOLD?



Yes, but you may only deliver three ballots (in addition to your own) and the "Bearer" section on the front of the return envelope must be signed in the presence of the voters whose ballots you are delivering.

12. IS IDENTIFICATION REQUIRED WHEN I DELIVER MY MAIL-IN BALLOT OR ANYONE ELSE'S BALLOT TO THE COUNTY BOARD OF ELECTIONS IN FREEHOLD?

Yes, one form of identification is required, with name, address and signature.

13. WILL MY VOTE COUNT IF I VOTE BY MAIL?

Yes. All timely and properly completed mail-in ballots will be counted.

14. WHAT IF MY VOTER SIGNATURE HAS CHANGED?

You can update your signature by contacting the County Superintendent of Elections at 732-431-7780, or by submitting a new voter registration form with your updated signature.

15. CAN I TRACK MY MAIL-IN BALLOT?

Yes. The State of NJ has two options: call 1-877-NJ-VOTER or go to the State Division of Elections website at trackmyballot.nj.gov.

16. IS IT BETTER TO RETURN MY MAIL-IN BALLOT OR TO VOTE ON A PROVISIONAL PAPER BALLOT AT THE POLLS ON ELECTION DAY?

For this year's General Election, it is better to return the mail-in ballot. Provisional ballots will be counted AFTER all of the mailin ballots, per State law.
